**RE: Conditions at the Wabash Courthouse**

Dear Chief Judge Barbera, Chief Judge Morrissey, and Administrative Judge Waxman:

There continues to be an ongoing outbreak of COVID-19 at the District Courthouse located at 5800 Wabash Avenue in Baltimore, Maryland. Additionally, there are serious public health and safety concerns that predate this outbreak, which have further exacerbated its potential spread through the building and into the community.

We, the members of Local 423 (the Maryland Defenders Union) and Local 3674 (Maryland Judiciary Employees) therefore issue this joint list of demands, to combat a crisis that continues to threaten our members, our clients, and our families. We are the clerks, attorneys, social workers, and support staff who must continue to risk our lives amidst unsafe conditions.

We demand:

- 1) That the Wabash Avenue building immediately close for a 72 hour period

Every AFSCME Maryland State and University contract guarantees a right to union representation. An employee has the right to a union representative if requested by the employee.

## Conditions at the Wabash Courthouse

- 2) That, during this closure, the Wabash Avenue building be completely and thoroughly cleaned and disinfected
- 3) That workers be allowed to open windows (to increase airflow and protect their own health and safety) without risk of reprimand or retaliation
- 4) That the Administrative Judge modify dockets so that all non-criminal matters be held remotely. Only criminal matters for incarcerated litigants should be docketed for in-person hearings, with all remaining matters postponed until the safety issues at the courthouse are resolved.
- 5) That the courthouse immediately install adequate Plexiglas dividers between workers, and between workers and the public
- 6) That the judiciary immediately communicate the existence and location of any and all COVID-19 positive courthouse entrants to all courthouse workers
- 7) That the courthouse return to alternating shifts for clerks and staff
- 8) That all workers be provided with adequate PPE
- 9) That public entry into the clerk's office be more strictly limited
- 10) That the court take immediate action to develop reasonable enforcement alternatives for both entry-point screening questionnaires and mask mandates, as courthouse security has continually failed to follow and enforce these basic rules
